Thankfully, our area has not been stuck in a perpetual state of winter like other parts of the country and a new season is just around the



corner. MOSO CAPS Student Associates started this semester by presenting their takeaways from their fall semester industry partner experiences to their peers. The four three-week experiences go by guickly but allows the students to capture a glimpse into what a specific career could look like from four different industry partner perspectives. Some students identified that the career they thought they wanted was not for them. When this happens, MOSO CAPS allows students to pivot and experience new placements in a different career field with great success. With Spring Break upon us, many MOSO CAPS Student Associates are preparing to begin their second extended industry partner placement this semester. This incredible year-long journey would not be possible without the support of our 180+ industry partners.

According to AI, "growing pains" refers to "temporary difficulties or struggles that occur during a period of developmental growth..." In the last newsletter, I stated that MOSO CAPS continues to see steady growth and that we should reach out target goal of 90 students within the next few years. We opened our 25-26 application on Monday, January 13 and have over 140 applicants for 90 seats! This is definitely a milestone in the program and discussions are already being held to address how we can expand MOSO CAPS beyond 90 seats. As part of the MOSO CAPS program, student associates participate in a CAPStone Project each spring, either individually or in a group. CAPStone Projects are service -minded projects that showcase student creativity and problem-solving skills while supporting the local community.

This year the morning MOSO CAPS Student Associates were given the task of adopting one of the many flowerbeds located on the MSSU campus. Students were split into three groups and each group was assigned a specific bed with a budget and timeline to cleanout, plant and mulch their flowerbed.

Students had to appoint a project manager, bed designer, budget manager, mar-


