Pre-nursing, Application Ready:

These tasks are only if you are ready to apply to the program and are an active MSSU student. **Do not** begin these steps until the potential pre-nursing student checklist is completed.

- All Core 42 courses are completed; the student must ensure that their Degree Works is up-todate and reflects all coursework completed.
- □ The student has a 2.8 or better cumulative college GPA
- □ The student has completed all nursing prerequisites with a C or better in 2 or fewer attempts or will complete them by the end of the last full semester before nursing classes begin.
 - 0 Students with remaining pre-nursing/general education requirements are advised to complete all requirements before admission no later than the Spring and/or Fall semesters. No required coursework will be accepted after the semester before admission, including missing partial credit hours for transfer courses that do not articulate to the MSSU designated credit hours. Conditional admission may be granted for students enrolled in Spring coursework, including pre-nursing/general education requirements. Courses must be completed with a C or better, and the GPA must remain above 2.8 for conditional admission to remain active.

A criminal record check and urine drug screen are required for admission to the Nursing Program, as well as other clinical site requirements such as immunizations, physical examination by a health care provider, TB test, completed American Heart Association Basic Life Support, and others. A packet of admission materials and an acceptance letter will be mailed to the primary mailing address.

Students found guilty of Class A or B felonies or placed on the Missouri Family Care Safety Registry disqualification list will be **ineligible to enter or continue in the Nursing Program**. The Nursing program reserves the right to deny acceptance or continuation in the program for the following circumstances:

- A student is found to have a criminal record or arrest record regardless of a charge and/or outcome of the arrest/charge.
- A student or applicant does not disclose a history of criminal record or arrest record.
